The community speed watch scheme was discussed as Holbrook PC were collating the information about which parishes wanted to be involved it was reported that approximately 60% have given a yes or no answer some still to confirm so it has been agreed to wait until the next meeting to make a final decision on the scheme.

Holbrook PC is going to be putting up CCTV and lights on the Reade Road field behind the co-op to deter anti-social behaviour.

PCSO Gibson is setting up an alcohol-tagging scheme in Shotley in the forth-coming months to help reduce alcohol related anti-social behaviour.

Attendees of meeting made aware about recent diesel thefts in area and for parish councils to make residents aware to secure diesel tanks.
