

**NOTICE OF PROPOSED WAITING RESTRICTIONS, PARKING PLACES AND  
DISABLED PARKING PLACES IN SHOTLEY**

**SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL  
(PARISH OF SHOTLEY) (VARIOUS ROADS) (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF  
WAITING AND ON-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 200-**

Suffolk County Council proposes to make the above order under Sections 1, 2, 4 and 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The effect of the order will be as follows:

1. To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. daily on the western side of Bristol Hill, from (and including) its junction with Lower Harlings in a generally southerly direction to a point outside St Helier, just south of the current location of the bus stop. To also include its junctions with and into Estuary Crescent and Estuary Road.
2. To prohibit waiting at any time on the following lengths of road:
  - a) Both sides of Caledonia Road from a point 10 metres east of its junction with Bristol Hill, extending around the corner into Bristol Hill.
  - b) Both sides of Battery Lane from a point 5 metres east of its junction with Bristol Hill, extending around the corner into Bristol Hill.
  - c) On the western side of Bristol Hill, from a point outside St Helier, just south of the current location of the bus stop, around the corner to the start of the parking bays.
  - d) For a distance of 8 metres around the corner of the junction of Bristol Hill and Queen Victoria Drive outside the Bristol Arms pub.
  - e) On the northern side of Queen Victoria Drive, from a point 23 metres east of its junction with Bristol Hill to the start of the parking bays.
  - f) On the southern side of Queen Victoria Drive for a distance of 7 metres across the entrance to the pier.
3. To formalise the existing parking bays on the northern and southern sides of Queen Victoria Drive for the use of passenger vehicles, light goods vehicles and blue badge holders, and to provide a maximum of 3 disabled persons' parking bays on the southern side of Queen Victoria Drive.

Exemptions to the waiting restrictions allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to board or alight; goods to be loaded or unloaded; for building, industrial or demolition works; for the maintenance of the road or the services therein, and for certain other purposes specified in the order. There are the usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles. Full details may be obtained from the order.

Please bear in mind that any such correspondence cannot be regarded as confidential and may be inspected by any interested party.
